Primary Provider Scholarship

Women of the South Primary Provider scholarships are available to those women who are the sole or primary providers of their household. Recipients of this scholarship will receive funding from Women of the South to obtain an associate degree from Oklahoma City Community College. The scholarship includes tuition, fees, and books paid directly to the college.



OKLAHOMA CITY COMMUNITY COLLEGE



A recipient:

- Must be a primary provider.
- Possess a high school diploma or equivalent.
- Reside in south Oklahoma City metropolitan area.
- Family income level must fall within the guidelines detailed on the application.

Applications must be postmarked by April 15



High School Scholarship

Women of the South awards scholarships to young women graduating from high schools located in south Oklahoma City and Moore. Senior women students from the following high schools are eligible to apply for the scholarships: Capitol Hill High School, Southeast High School, U.S. Grant High School, Santa Fe South Charter High School, Moore High School, Westmoore High School, Southmoore High School, Pathways and Western Heights High School.

Recipients will receive a \$2,000.00 scholarship, \$1,000.00 each semester. The recipient must be entering an Oklahoma college or university as a first-time freshman in the fall following their senior year in high school. A grade point average of 2.5 is required to apply for the scholarship. The award is determined on the basis of financial need, school and community honors, extracurricular activities and academic achievement.

Applications must be postmarked by February 28



Bachelor Degree Scholarship

Bachelor Degree Scholarship recipients will receive funding to achieve a Bachelor's Degree through an Oklahoma College or University. This includes \$1,000.00 per semester for a total of six (6) semesters to be paid directly to the Bursar's office.



(Summer semesters not included.)

A recipient:

- Must be a past Primary Provider Scholarship recipient.
- Possess an Associates Degree.
- Reside in south Oklahoma City metropolitan area.
- Family income level must fall within the guidelines detailed on the application.

Applications must be postmarked by March 31
